

Question: Can I appeal a traffic citation at the police station?

Answer: No. On the back of the citation you received, it explains in detail how you can handle the citation. You have the right to request a hearing, but you only have 20 days to submit it to the RMV. After that time you will be responsible for the full ticket amount.

Question: Will the Police Department unlock my car if I lock the keys in it?

Answer: We will attempt to open your vehicle in the event you lock your keys in it. Prior to any officer working on your locks you will be required to sign a release form. This form states that the Town and the Officer assume no liability for any damage that may happen while attempting to assist you.

We understand that being locked out of your car may be an emergency to you. **However, unless there is a child in the vehicle**, a response from an officer may be delayed because of other incidents going on in Town. We will get to you as soon as it is possible. Please be patient.

Question: If I'm involved in a motor vehicle collision what do I need to do?

Answer: If you are involved in a motor vehicle accident in Franklin where someone is injured, or if there is over \$1000 in damage to a vehicle or property, you must submit an accident report to the Registry of Motor Vehicles within five days. You must also submit a copy of the accident form to the Franklin Police Department, and one for your insurance company.

Question: How do I obtain a parking permit for the Municipal lots?

Answer: Submit your name, phone number and vehicle registration information to: [PCO LaRosa](#). The permits are issued via a lottery every quarter beginning in January (Jan-Mar, Apr-Jun, Jul-Sep, Oct-Dec). The cost is \$120 per permit per quarter.
